





- 991 Subapplications
- Exceeded \$5 Billion
- 98 Small & Impoverished Communities
- FY 2020 results announced early July

- Increase projects that mitigate risk to one or more lifelines
- Promote projects that incorporate naturebased solutions
- Incentivize adoption and enforcement of modern building codes







BRIC – Available Funding

\$1 Billion for FY2021



Recap of FY2020

- State/Territory Allocation: \$33.6 million (up to \$600,000 per Applicant)
 - All 50 states, the District of Columbia, and U.S. territories may apply under the State/Territory Allocation
- Tribal Set-Aside: \$20 million
 - All Tribal governments (federally recognized) may apply under the Tribal Set-Aside
- National Competition for Mitigation Projects: \$446.4 million (estimated)
 - Remaining funds which are not awarded from the State/Territory Allocation or Tribal Set-Aside will be included in the national competition





Non-Disaster Mitigation Grants Application Cycle and Funding Deadlines FY 2020 Recap

NOFO posted to Grants.gov – August 3, 2020 Application period - September 30, 2020 - January 29, 2021 Eligibility and Technical Reviews – February – May 2021 Selections - June 2021 Period of performance – 36/48 months from Award Acceptance Period of Performance 36/48 Months 2020 2021 2022 2023 2024+

Application period opens on September 30, 2020.

Submission deadline for applications is 3:00 PM ET on January 29, 2021.

*States have set earlier submission deadlines. (Ex. Maryland submission deadline is November 20, 2020)

System-related issues must be addressed by 3:00 PM ET on January 27, 2021.

Pre-Award Selection Notice: Anticipated end of June 2021

Period of Performance:

Start Date: When the recipient accepts the Award

End Date: All projects are **36 months** from the date of the Award EXCEPT for FMA Community Flood Mitigation Projects which are **48 months** from the Award date



Cost Share Requirements

Cost Share:

Generally FEMA will pay up to 75 percent of the total cost

BRIC:

- FEMA will pay up to 90 percent for small impoverished communities
- FEMA will pay up to 100 percent for management costs
- Non-federal cost share can be made up of cash, labor, in-kind or third-party donations



BRIC Funding Limits




- State/Territory Maximum Allocation and Activity Caps: \$600,000
 - Up to \$300,000 may be used for mitigation planning and planning-related activities per applicant
- Tribal Set-Aside Activity Caps: The combined cost of the applicant's capability- and- capacity building activities under the Tribal Set-Aside must not exceed \$600,000 per applicant
- National Competition Project Cap: \$50 million per subapplication





BRIC Eligible Activities

Existing Activities are Still Eligible



Expanded Eligibility Includes:

- **Project scoping**
- **Building code activities**
- **Pre-award costs**
- Additional activities for wildfire and wind implementation (DRRA **Section 1205**)
- **Earthquake early warning** (DRRA Section 1233)

Projects Must:

- Be cost-effective
- Reduce/eliminate risk and damage from future natural hazards
- Meet latest two consensus codes (i.e., 2015 or 2018 international building code)
- **Align with Hazard Mitigation Plan**
- Meet all environmental and historic preservation requirements



How is BRIC Different Than PDM?

Builds Capability

- Capability & capacitybuilding activities
- In-person nonfinancial technical assistance

- Increases caps
- Allows pre-award costs

- New application process through FEMA GO
- Project extensions
- Phased projects








Local Building Codes & Enforcement

Building codes are the cornerstone of a resilient community, but less than 35 percent of communities have adopted the latest, most up-to-date hazard-resistant codes.











BRIC Application Scoring – Technical Criteria from FY 2020








BRIC Application Scoring – Qualitative Criteria from FY 2020





BRIC APPLICATION SCORING





What is happening now with BRIC? How about the future?

Application Review Process:

- **FEMA GO** is the platform to submit applications
- Selections for BRIC/FMA FY 2020 anticipated in early July 2021
- BRIC/FMA FY 2021 NOFO anticipated release July/August 2021
- Anticipated BRIC/FMA application period opening September 30, 2021
- Important to remember: States will have state specific deadlines to review applications (range from Oct. –Dec.)
- BRIC/FMA applications will likely be due in FEMA GO by FEMA by January 28, 2022

Future of BRIC:

- BRIC is funded by 6% set aside of the DRF available funding amounts will vary each year (FY 2021 = 1 Billion)
- Applicants & sub-applicants can incur costs now for applications submitted next grant cycle
- Leveraging partnerships, diversified funding opportunities for projects, economic development partners, capital improvement plans, shared funding mechanisms and/or shared project design, and creative ways to identify Nonfederal cost share (match)
- We do not anticipate major design changes for FY 2021; Emphasis on equity & climate change and adaptation

Challenges

- National Campaign = High Visibility
- National level messaging at times caused confusion
 - Applicant vs. subapplicant
 - State deadlines
- Roll out of new grants management system
 - Registered users
 - System issues and "bugs"
 - SAMS / DUNS
 - Training

- Ongoing response to COVID 19 (capacity)
- Staff turnover
- Changing mindset from PDM to BRIC
- Think Big, Think Bold. What does that mean exactly?
- Subapplications clear understanding of time investment required to produce high quality supplications that will score competitively during NTR

Application Deadlines

- **Get connected with your State Hazard Mitigation** Officer (SHMO)
- Application period for FY 2021 is set to open on September 30, 2021 - NOT FINAL UNTIL NOFO IS RELEASED
- Applications must be received in FEMA GO by January 28, 2022, at 3:00 PM Eastern Time - NOT FINAL UNTIL NOFO IS RELEASED
 - States will set earlier submission deadlines



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
